In 1948 a group of leading librarians and library educators founded Beta Phi Mu, the library and information science honor society. Aware of the notable achievements of honor societies in other professions, they believed such an organization would have much to offer librarianship and library education. More than 25,000 graduates of accredited library and information science programs in the United States, Canada, and international institutions have been initiated.

The name Beta Phi Mu is formed from the initial letters of the Greek words biblioteki froneos medeontes, "Librarians are the guardians of knowledge." Our motto "aliis inserviendo consumor" may be translated as, "Consumed in the service of others." The lamp used during our initiation ceremony is an ancient symbol of learning. The heat and light of the flame signify labor and devotion; the lamp itself, universal education.
